City Compost and Mulch Sales

Compost Sale: Friday, March 23, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and Saturday, March 24, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m

Mulch Sale: Thursday, April 12, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Friday, April 13, 8 a.m. to 3p.m., and Saturday, April 14, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m @ 1420 E. 11th St. The city's compost sale will be held on Friday, March 23, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and Saturday, March 24, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The compost sale will close early if the supply is depleted. The cost is \$10 per truck load; the price will be more for larger trucks or trailers (cash only, please). The city cannot load trucks with ladder racks. This compost is not intended for commercial applications, but rather for the citizens of Lawrence. Dump truck quantities are not allowed. If you load the compost yourself, there is no charge. Bring shovels and buckets if you plan to load your own

The City of Lawrence woodchip sale will be held Thursday, April 12, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Friday, April 13, 8 a.m. to 3p.m., and Saturday, April 14, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. (or until supplies are depleted). The woodchip sale takes place at the city's Wood Recovery and Composting facility located at 1420 E. 11th St. The sale is held rain or shine. Cost is \$10 per pick up load; the price will be more for larger trucks. Patrons are asked to bring a tarp for their pickup to secure woodchips, preventing woodchips from littering the roadway when leaving the facility.

A Note from the Opposition to the Bus Hub at the Depot

Some East Lawrence Neighbors have formed a group to oppose the proposition that the Amtrak Depot at 7th and New York St. be converted to a bus hub and intercity bus station. Important information about the proposed East Lawrence bus hub:

1. 7th and New Jersey was picked as the location for a bus hub and intercity bus station without any proper site selection process. A developer wanted to move the bus transfer point away from his new building and a special interest group hoped to get funding by turning the train depot into a bus station.

- 2. There are now no buses running down 7th Street, because there is <u>no reason for them to go</u> there. Under this proposal every bus in Lawrence will be routed there and back out once an hour. Close to 200 buses a day will run down 7th street and back out each day.
- 3. The bus hub is also intended to serve intercity (Greyhound) buses at all hours of the day and night dropping people with limited knowledge of Lawrence into a residential area.
- 4. A bus hub will be a magnet for homeless people, and will increase crime, vandalism, and disturbances in the neighborhood.
- 5. There are currently <u>no services</u> for bus patrons -- but special interest groups promise that commercial development will follow once the bus hub/station is in place. This is the first step in massive commercial development targeted at the neighborhood.
- 6. Until developers are able to continue the <u>commercial development</u> and destruction of the East Lawrence residential neighborhood, bus users will have a seven minute walk to downtown.
- 7. If you live nearby, your property values will go down even if your taxes don't.
- 8. If you live anywhere except near the station, you may have to walk much farther to catch a bus. Current plans call for moving a portion of the station's parking to the east side of the building and restoration of the green space on the west side. With the east side of the station property converted to a bus turnaround, this will not be possible. Parking for the station will continue to be inadequate.
- . Buses will be parked and idling along 7^{th} Street increasing <u>congestion and noise</u> for neighbors from early in the morning to late in the evening every day of the week.
- . Buses pulling in and out along the busy 7th Street curve will create a <u>dangerous traffic hazard</u>.
- . The increased diesel particulate matter and noise will create health problems for East Lawrence residents and visitors to the neighborhood. Diesel emissions are a large contributor to juvenile asthma.

Think it won't happen? City Commissioners are being advised that they can avoid proper feasibility and environmental impact studies if they use city funds to turn the train depot into a bus station. Why do you suppose the city wouldn't want to do a location analysis or an environmental impact study? Do you think this would be proposed in a more affluent neighborhood? Posted 3/8/12

City Yard Trimmings Collection Begins

The City of Lawrence curbside yard trimmings collection began on Monday, March 5th. The City's Solid Waste crews will make the weekly pickups on Mondays through mid-December, except on

holidays.

Materials should be set out on Mondays by 6:00 a.m. in a can, city cart or compostable paper bag. Plastic bags are not allowed for the containerization of yard trimmings. Yard trimmings, grass clippings,

leaves, and small brush and garden debris, are not sent to the landfill, but are instead transported directly to the City's Wood Recycling and Compost Facility.

Small woody debris may also be placed at the curb on Mondays with yard trimmings for composting. Small woody debris should be set out in a can, city cart or compostable paper bag and should not be tied or bundled and should not extend more than one foot above the container opening.

Wheeled carts, 90-gallon capacity for \$2.00 per month and 65-gallon capacity for \$1.50 per month, are available through the City's Solid Waste Division by calling (785) 832-3032. Compostable paper bags specifically for yard trimmings are available at several Lawrence retailers including garden, hardware, grocery and home improvement stores.

Alternatives to setting out yard trimmings for curbside collection are mulch mowing and backyard composting. Backyard composting bins are available for sale to Lawrence residents receiving residential trash service from the City of Lawrence by calling (785) 832-3030. Reductions in Water and Sewer Services Charges Available for Low-Income Elderly

A low-income elderly person, (one who is sixty years of age or more on or before the 1st day of January of the year in which the reduced services charge is applicable,) and has an income during the preceding calendar year from all sources of less than \$11,979, (or any elderly person who is the head of a family with a family income during the preceding calendar year from all sources of less than \$16,181) may qualify for a reduction in city services charges. If approved, a low income elderly person shall pay a flat rate monthly charge per dwelling of 35% the regular monthly residential water and sanitary sewer charge. Applications for reduced charges shall be on forms supplied by the City, filed or mailed to the Utility Billing Division of the Department of finance. Applications and more information can be requested of the Utility Billing Division at 832-7878.

City Adds Four New Glass Recycling Bins

The City of Lawrence Waste Reduction and Recycling Division will place four glass recycling drop-off collection bins in the parking lots of:

- · Dillons, 4701 West 6th Street
- · Hy-Vee, 3504 Clinton Parkway
- · Hy-Vee, 4000 West 6th Street
- · On The Rocks, 1818 Massachusetts Street

In the bright purple glass recycling drop-off bins, residents and businesses may place glass food and beverage containers of any color. All brown, green, blue, and clear glass bottles and jars can be mixed together in the same collection bin. Labels on the glass containers do not have to be removed. Items not

accepted for recycling in these collection bins include plate glass (windows), mirrors, Pyrex, CorningWare, ceramics, and dishes.

Introducing Lawrence Community Orchard!

The Lawrence Community Orchard (LCO) is a project of the Lawrence Fruit Tree Project (LFTP), made possible by the City of Lawrence Common Ground Program

(http://lawrenceks.org/common_ground). After an application process, Lawrence Fruit Tree Project was chosen to lease the site at the eastern end of Garfield St. bordering the Burroughs Creek Rail Trail in the East Lawrence Neighborhood. The site will evolve over the next several years into an ecological orchard with a park-like atmosphere. The site will produce nutritious foods and serve as a perennial food gardening demonstration and educational space for the greater community.

A Note from the Opposition to the Bus Hub at the Depot

Some East Lawrence Neighbors have formed a group to oppose the proposition that the Amtrak Depot at 7th and New York St. be converted to a bus hub and intercity bus station. They would like to share with you the following information for consideration. For more information, contact Jennifer Lattimore, 704 New York Street -- (785) 813-1827 and why.buses@gmail.com

<u>Important information about the proposed East Lawrence bus hub:</u>

- 1. 7th and New Jersey was picked as the location for a bus hub and intercity bus station without any proper site selection process. A developer wanted to move the bus transfer point away from his new building and a special interest group hoped to get funding by turning the train depot into a bus station.
- 2. There are now no buses running down 7^{th} Street , because there is <u>no reason for them to go there</u>. Under this proposal <u>every bus</u> in Lawrence will be routed there and back out once an hour. Close to 200 buses a day will run down 7^{th} street and back out each day.
- 3. The bus hub is also intended to serve intercity (Greyhound) buses at all hours of the day and night dropping people with limited knowledge of Lawrence into a residential area.
- 4. A bus hub will be a magnet for homeless people, and will increase crime, vandalism, and disturbances in the neighborhood.
- 5. There are currently <u>no services</u> for bus patrons -- but special interest groups promise that commercial development will follow once the bus hub/station is in place. This is the first step in massive commercial development targeted at the neighborhood.
- 6. Until developers are able to continue the <u>commercial development</u> and destruction of the East Lawrence residential neighborhood, bus users will have a seven-minute walk to downtown.
- 7. If you live nearby, your <u>property values</u> will go down even if your taxes don't.
- 8. If you live anywhere except near the station, you may have to walk much farther to catch a bus.
- 9. Current plans call for moving a portion of the station's parking to the east side of the building and restoration of the green space on the west side. With the east side of the station property converted to a bus turnaround, this will not be possible. Parking for the station will continue to be inadequate.

- 10. Buses will be parked and idling along 7th Street increasing <u>congestion and noise</u> for neighbors from early in the morning to late in the evening every day of the week.
- 11. Buses pulling in and out along the busy 7th Street curve will create a <u>dangerous</u> traffic hazard.
- 12. The increased diesel particulate matter and noise will create health problems for East Lawrence residents and visitors to the neighborhood. Diesel emissions are a large contributor to juvenile asthma.

Think it won't happen? City Commissioners are being advised that they can <u>avoid</u> <u>proper feasibility and environmental impact studies</u> if they use city funds to turn the train depot into a bus station. **Why do you suppose the city wouldn't** want to do a location analysis or an environmental impact study? Do you think this would be proposed in a more affluent neighborhood? Posted 3/8/12

City Yard Trimmings Collection Begins

The City of Lawrence curbside yard trimmings collection began on Monday, March 5th. The City's Solid Waste crews will make the weekly pickups on Mondays

through mid-December, except on holidays.

Materials should be set out on Mondays by 6:00 a.m. in a can, city cart or compostable paper bag. Plastic bags are not allowed for the containerization of yard trimmings. Yard trimmings, grass clippings,

leaves, and small brush and garden debris, are not sent to the landfill, but are instead transported directly to the City's Wood Recycling and Compost Facility.

Small woody debris may also be placed at the curb on Mondays with yard trimmings for composting. Small woody debris should be set out in a can, city cart or compostable paper bag and should not be tied or bundled and should not extend more than one foot above the container opening.

Wheeled carts, 90-gallon capacity for \$2.00 per month and 65-gallon capacity for \$1.50 per month, are available through the City's Solid Waste Division by calling (785) 832-3032. Compostable paper bags specifically for yard trimmings are available at several Lawrence retailers including garden, hardware, grocery and home improvement stores.

Alternatives to setting out yard trimmings for curbside collection are mulch mowing and backyard composting. Backyard composting bins are available for sale to Lawrence residents receiving residential trash service from the City of Lawrence by calling (785) 832-3030. Reductions in Water and Sewer Services Charges Available for Low-Income Elderly

A low-income elderly person, (one who is sixty years of age or more on or before the 1st day of January of the year in which the reduced services charge is applicable,) and has an income during the preceding calendar year from all sources of less than \$11,979, (or any elderly person who is the head of a family with a family income during the preceding calendar year from all sources of less than \$16,181) may qualify for a reduction in city services charges. If approved, a low-income elderly person shall pay a flat rate monthly charge per dwelling of 35% the regular monthly residential water and sanitary sewer charge. Applications for reduced charges shall be on forms supplied by the City, filed or mailed to the Utility Billing Division of the Department of finance.
