


LAWRENCE Economy 2013

The Budget

- 2013 Budget \$174 million (all funds)
 - Includes a .92 mill levy increase to provide for additional police equipment and public safety officers
 - Funding for street maintenance remains a priority
 - Economic development initiatives included



Farmland Redevelopment

- Beginning infrastructure installation in 2013
- The city's goal is to create additional business park and industrial space in Lawrence



Farmland Redevelopment



Bioscience & Technology Business Center

- Expansion occurring in 2013; city and county have committed to funding for expansion
- The BTBC houses 9 tenant companies and has produced 71 jobs



Poehler Building

- Poehler Building (East Lawrence 8th Street)
 - Continued redevelopment of historic buildings into modern uses





9th and New Hampshire

- Plans in development for multi-story building on southeast corner of intersection which include a hotel, condominiums and retail space
- Plans in development for apartments/office space on northeast corner





- The city's previous improvements in water and wastewater systems has allowed the city to meet customer demand and provide for future expansion needs.
 - 2 water treatment facilities (Kaw and Clinton Lake)


Public Safety

- The city continues to invest in its public safety resources
- Continue to provide resources for equipment needs
- City added 5 new officers in 2012 and will add an additional 3 offers in 2013

Sustainability Efforts

- Energy audits performed at City Hall, Arts Center and Investigations Training Center
- Downtown LED lighting retrofit
- HVAC upgrade at Public Library - using 21% less energy



Sustainability Efforts

- Projects in our facilities:
 - All traffic signals changed to LEDs
 - Established glass recycling program in 2012
 - 3 hybrid buses added to transit fleet



Trash Carts

- Trash carts delivered to all single-family households in October and November
- Multiple sizes offered for household needs



Record Water Use in 2012


- City was able to meet demand with the 2012 record temperatures and drought
