## Overview:

The Lawrence Arts Center seeks to partner with the City of Lawrence on the 2013 NEA Our Town grant application requesting funding for arts- based digital media projects and education for all children, downtown and East Lawrence access to broadband, and a city wide film festival. The Arts Center will take the lead on this project that will support community goals and work with community member towards increased economic vitality and cultural tourism following the principles of Creative Placemaking. The Arts Center will work with city staff to devise metrics to measure economic and other impact. Artist Luke DuBois will come to Lawrence as Artist-in-residence to work with local artists, digital designers, and other creative professionals to make this plan happen.

## Free State Film and Music Festival: Culminating Event

The Lawrence Arts Center's Free State Film Festival is a weekend long event inviting dialogue between local and national artists and a broad spectrum of audiences through the shared experience of thought-provoking cinema. The festival includes feature films, short films, panel discussions and an experimental film and music video showcase. We celebrate not only the film art form, but its relationship to other mediums such as visual arts and music in an effort to reflect the unique culture of the city of Lawrence, Kansas. The 2012 festival showcased both national and feature films in an effort to stimulate attendance and provide connections between national and regional artists. Feature films included the documentary, *Charles Bradley: Soul of America*, based on the rise of soul music sensation whose 2011 album was named one of Rolling Stone's Albums of the Year; *Compliance*, the most talked about film at Sundance Film Festival; Patrick Rea's local horror film, *Nailbiter*; and *Corporate FM*, a documentary on local radio trends. FSFF 2013 will offer expanded film offerings, educational opportunities led by visiting artists, and further integration of live music. We seek collaboration with community partners to help us make this a film festival of regional and national importance. Committed partners include: Love Garden, the

Lawrence Public Library, St. Luke's AME Church, Warehouse Arts District, The Bottleneck, Through a Glass Productions, The Eyedoctors Optometrists, Watkins History Museum.
