

Downtown Parking Info



Free and metered public spaces are available in Downtown Lawrence. Short-term parking is provided along Massachusetts and long-term (5-10 hours) parking is provided in parking lots along the perimeter of the Central Business District. The long-term parking spaces are intended for employees of downtown businesses and others with long-term parking needs.

Parking passes

The City offers parking passes for the 10-hour, meters and metered lots (see map inside) for \$192 per calendar year and value passes, valid at 3 lots, for \$160. Pro-rated and quarterly passes are available. Parking passes may be purchased at the Utility Bill window, 2nd floor, City Hall, Sixth and Massachusetts, or at Municipal Court, 1006 New Hampshire.

Enforcement

Tickets for parking violations are issued between 9:30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Parking on Sunday is free in all areas.

Types of Parking



Short-Term

- 2-Hour Metered Parking
- 2-Hour Free Parking

Long-Term

- 5-Hour Metered Street Parking
- 10-Hour Metered Parking
- 10-Hour Free Parking (700 block of Rhode Island near Borders)
- Riverfront Parking Garage
- 900 Block New Hampshire Parking Garage
- Accessible parking spaces and bicycle parking are available throughout downtown.

Parking Violations



Parking regulations are strictly enforced in Downtown Lawrence. Parking violations are noted by a yellow envelope. The fine is \$2 if paid within 10 days. If you are cited, simply place \$2 in the yellow envelope and deposit in the nearest yellow box along Massachusetts or located in one of the public parking lots. Parking fines increase to \$10 plus Municipal Court costs after 10 days. Payments may be mailed to:

If a vehicle is parked illegally downtown (at an expired meter or in a two-hour lot) and has received five or more overtime parking violations within the past 30 days, the owner will also receive a separate citation with a fine of \$50. This ordinance is designed to deter habitual violators of downtown parking regulations.

The Downtown Lawrence Parking system is supported solely by meter receipts and overtime fines. Funds allow the city to pay for landscaping, trash removal, lighting, other lot and meter improvements and maintenance, and enforcement of parking ordinances. The system receives no property tax or sales tax revenues.
