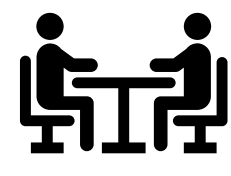

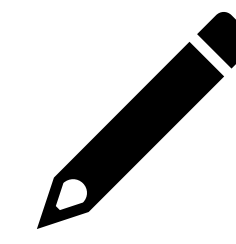

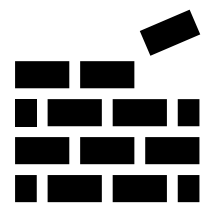

Goal 1: Clearly defined public space reflecting traditional development patterns and materials.

Example Policies and Objectives

- **Encourage** brick sidewalk along Connecticut, Rhode Island, and New York Streets.
- **Develop** a feature lighting and lighting policy.
- **Improve** physical conditions of alleys.

Goal 2: Connect East Lawrence residents, prioritizing non-vehicular movement.

Example Policies and Objectives

- **Enhance** pedestrian ways and signage connecting one node to another.
- **Grow** the relationship between the arts and East Lawrence, leveraging existing resources/activities like the Lawrence Arts Center.

Goal 3: Enhance the public right-of-way with a healthy street tree canopy.

Example Policies and Objectives

- **Establish** and maintain a healthy, mature, and diverse street tree canopy.
- **Grow** street tree canopy species and fill in gaps in the network.
- **Develop** a clear process for tree maintenance, removal, and replanting.
- **Phase** out disease susceptible tree species.

Goal 4: Management of on-street parking

Example Policies and Objectives

- **Preserve** residential parking in the neighborhood in areas that complete with higher intensity land uses.
- **Encourage** the increase of use of public transit, bicycle, and walking options.
- **Enhance** roadway and pedestrian safety in the East Lawrence neighborhood.
- **Develop** a pilot residential parking program to assess impact of managed on-street parking.
